POSITION STATEMENT

Under direction, to operate electric welding and shop equipment such as iron workers, hydraulic presses, cutoff saws, band saws, drill presses and magnetic drills; to operate an oxyacetylene torch and welding equipment in heating; cutting and performing related work in maintaining and repairing steel structures; and to do other related work.

ELIGIBLE LIST INFORMATION

A Departmental Open eligible list will be established for Caltrans in all Districts and Sacramento County. The names of successful competitors will be merged onto the list in order of final scores, regardless of date. Competitor's eligibility will expire 24 months after it is established unless the needs of the service and conditions of the list warrant a change in this period.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMITTANCE TO THE EXAMINATION

All applicants must meet the education and/or experience requirements for this examination by the cut-off date. Your signature on the application indicates that you read, understand, and possess the minimum qualifications required, and that the information provided is true and complete to the best of your knowledge.

All applications must include: “to” and “from” dates (month/day/year), time base, civil service or private sector titles, the duties performed, and an original signature. Applications received without this information will be rejected.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

License or Certification Requirements: Possession of the American Welding Society (AWS) D1.5 All-Positions Unlimited Plate Thickness Groove Test welding certification.

Experience: Three years of experience in electric arc welding and oxyacetylene cutting, one year of which must have been on bridge or similar high structures.

EXAMINATION INFORMATION

This examination will utilize an evaluation of each candidate’s experience and education/training compared to a standard developed from the class specification. For this reason, it is especially important that each candidate take special care in accurately and completely filling out his or her application. List all experience relevant to the “Minimum Qualifications” shown on this announcement. Supplementary information will be accepted, but read the “Minimum Qualifications” carefully to see what kind of information will be useful to the staff doing the evaluation.

This examination will be weighted 100%. In order to obtain a position on the eligible list, a minimum score of 70% must be attained.

Applications will be accepted on a continuous basis. Testing is considered continuous, as new test dates can be set at any time as departmental needs warrant.

KNOWLEDGE AND ABILITIES

Knowledge of:

1. Welding symbols, methods, materials, tools, and equipment used in fusion welding on structural steel and metal alloys
2. Proper methods of applying heat to structural steel member
3. Basic safety practices contained in the California Code of regulations, Title 8 Industrial Relations, Construction Safety orders, and the General Industry of Safety Orders regarding personal protective equipment
4. Hand tools used for metal working (forging) and fabrication (building/assembly)
5. Power tools used for metal fabrication

Ability to:

1. Used an electric welder and a gas welder in cutting and welding work and their adjustment and maintenance
2. Operate shop equipment such as iron workers, hydraulic presses, cutoff saws band saws, drill presses, and magnetic drills
3. Read, interpret, and work from plans, drawings and specifications
4. Follow directions
5. Work at considerable heights over land and water
6. Do fabrication and repair of moveable ladders, scaffolding, staging, and miscellaneous bridge components and equipment
7. Use an electric welder and as welder for cutting and welding work in a confined space while wearing required personal protective equipment
8. Communicate effectively with those encountered in the course of work
9. Work in extreme weather conditions including, but not limited to, marine environments, extreme temperatures, and high winds
10. Work adjacent to moving traffic

ADDITIONAL DESIRABLE QUALIFICATIONS

Willingness to work rotating or irregular shifts including Holidays and weekends.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

Applicants for positions in this class are required to pass a drug screening test. Testing of current employees who are transferring is permitted on if the person does not have a current appointment to a class for which drug testing is a requirement.

VETERANS' PREFERENCE

Veterans' Preference will be applied to those competitors who are successful in this examination and who qualify for, and have requested, Veterans' Preference through the California Department of Human Resources.

CAREER CREDITS

Career Credits will not be granted in this examination.

GENERAL INFORMATION

For an examination without a written feature, it is the candidate's responsibility to contact **the testing department** three weeks after the cut-off date if he/she has not received his/her notice.

If you meet the requirements stated on this bulletin, you may take this examination, which is competitive. Possession of the entrance requirement does not assure a place on the eligible list. Your performance in the examination will be compared with the performance of the others who take this test, and all candidates who pass will be ranked according to their scores.

Caltrans reserves the right to revise the examination plan to better meet the needs of the service, if the circumstances under which this examination was planned change. Such revision will be in accordance with civil service laws and rules and all competitors will be notified.

Candidates needing special testing arrangements due to a disability must mark the appropriate box on the application and/or contact the testing department.

General Qualifications: Candidates must possess essential personal qualifications including integrity, initiative, dependability, good judgment, and the ability to work cooperatively with others; and a state of health consistent with the ability to perform the assigned duties of the class. A medical examination may be required. In open examinations, investigation may be made of employment records and personal history and fingerprinting may be required.

Eligible Lists: Eligible lists established by competitive examination, regardless of date, must be used in the following order: 1) sub-divisional promotional, 2) departmental promotional, 3) multi-departmental promotional, 4) service-wide promotional, 5) departmental open, 6) open. When there are two lists of the same kind, the older must be used first. Eligible lists will expire in one to four years unless otherwise stated on the bulletin.

Veterans' Preference: Pursuant to Assembly Bill 372, Veterans' Preference will be awarded as follows, starting January 1, 2014:

1. Any veteran, widow or widower of a veteran, or spouse of a 100 percent disabled veteran, who achieves a passing score in an open examination, shall be ranked in the top rank of the resulting eligibility list.

2. Any veteran who has been dishonorably discharged or released is not eligible for Veterans' Preference.
3. Veterans' Preference is not granted once a person achieves permanent civil service status (Permanent State civil service status means the status of an employee who is lawfully retained in his/her position after completion of the applicable probationary period. This includes permanent intermittent, part-time, and full-time appointments. In addition, individuals who at any time achieved permanent State civil service status and subsequently resigned or were dismissed from State civil service are not eligible to receive Veterans' Preference).

Veteran status is verified by the California Department of Human Resources (CalHR). Directions to apply for Veterans' Preference are on the Veterans' Preference Application (CalHR Form 1093) which is available at <https://jobs.ca.gov/Public/Jobs/Veterans.aspx>, CalHR, and the Department of Veterans Affairs.
