CONTINUOUS TESTING

CUT-OFF DATES: FEBRUARY 4 AND AUGUST 4

Testing is considered continuous as Examination Applications (STD 678) will be accepted on a continuous basis and cut-off dates can be set at any time as departmental needs warrant. Cut-off dates will be announced on the "Notice to Announce Cut-off Date." Applications postmarked or submitted in person after the cut-off date will be held until the next administration. Dates printed on Mobile Bar Codes, such as the Quick Response (QR) Codes available at the USPS, are not considered Postmark dates for the purpose of determining timely filing of an application. Faxed or emailed applications will not be accepted.

WHO SHOULD APPLY

Candidates who meet the minimum qualifications of the classification, as stated on this examination bulletin, may apply.

SPECIAL TESTING INFORMATION

If you have a disability and need special testing arrangements, mark the appropriate box in Question 2 of the Examination Application (STD 678). You will be contacted to make specific arrangements.

ELIGIBLE LIST INFORMATION

The names of successful competitors will be merged onto the list in order of final scores. The list will be abolished 12 months after it is established unless the needs of the service and conditions of the list warrant a change in this period. Competitors must then retest to reestablish eligibility.

TESTING PERIOD

Competitors may test only once during a 10 month period.

EXAMINATION INFORMATION

NO INTERVIEWS WILL BE CONDUCTED. The entire examination will consist of a Qualifications Assessment weighted 100%. In order to obtain a position on the eligible list, a minimum rating of 70% must be attained in the examination.

POSITION DESCRIPTION

The Transportation Surveyor is the entry, first working, and journey level of professional survey work. Under the direction of a licensed land surveyor, incumbents perform a wide variety of professional land surveying work in either an office or field setting. As incumbents progress in experience, they will be assigned more difficult work and may function as a lead person over activities of various surveying and technical personnel in the office or field. At the journey level, and with a license, the incumbent will work in a responsible charge capacity.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMITTANCE TO THE EXAMINATION

All applicants must meet the minimum qualifications for this examination by the CUT-OFF DATES listed on this bulletin.

Graduation from a four-year curriculum in surveying, surveying engineering, or surveying geomatics accredited by the Accreditation Board for Engineering Technology. (Registration as a "Senior" in such a curriculum will admit an applicant to the competition, but applicants must produce evidence of graduation before being considered eligible for appointment.)

(Possession of a valid certificate as a Land Surveyor in Training issued or accepted by the California Board of Registration for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors or possession of a valid certificate as an Engineer in Training accepted by the California Board of Registration for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors in lieu of a certificate as a Land Surveyor in Training may be substituted for the required education.)

SCOPE OF EXAMINATION

In addition to evaluating the competitors' relative abilities as demonstrated by the quality and breadth of experience, emphasis in the examination interview will be on measuring competitively, relative to job demands, each competitor's:

- 4. Procedures, equipment, and materials used in surveying, including conventional and state of the art

- Mathematics and procedures used in plane and geodetic surveying
- Computer applications and usage
- 8. The California Coordinate System
- 9. Code of Safe Surveying Practices
- 10. Photogrammetric mapping procedures
 11. Principles and practices of boundary determination, land title research, and surveying
- 12. Legal descriptions of real property
- 13. Methods and terminology used in searching for land titles and factors involved in determining ownership of property
- 14. Real property acquisition and mapping laws pertaining to public and private ownership of real property
- 15. Monumentation of facilities
- The Land Surveyors' Act
- 17. The Subdivision Map Act



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- 18. Factors which influence the impact of departmental projects
- 19. Planning, design, construction, and right of way procedures and policies as they relate to surveys

Ability to:

VETERANS PREFERENCE

Assembly Bill 372, signed into law by Governor Brown on August 12, 2013, changes the way the Veterans Preference process is administered by the State of California. Veterans Preference will be awarded as follows, starting on January 1, 2014: 1) Any veteran, widow or widower of a veteran, or spouse of a 100 percent disabled veteran, who achieves a passing score in an entrance examination, shall be ranked in the top rank of the resulting eligibility list. Any veteran who has been dishonorably discharged or released is not eligible for Veteran's Preference. 2) An entrance exam is defined, under law, as any open competitive examination 3) Veterans Preference is not granted once a person achieves permanent civil service status.

CAREER CREDITS

Career Credits are not granted in open or promotional examinations.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Department of Water Resources reserves the right to revise the examination plan to better meet the needs of the service if the circumstances under which this examination was planned change. Such revision will be in accordance with civil service laws and rules and all competitors will be notified.

For an examination without a written feature, it is the candidate's responsibility to contact the Department of Water Resources three days prior to the written test date if he/she has not received his/her notice of appointment.

Applications are available at Department of Water Resources' (DWR) offices, the DWR website:

www.water.ca.gov/jobs/currentexams.cfm, local office of the Employment Development Department, and California Human Resources (CalHR) at www.jobs.ca.gov.

If you meet the requirements stated on the reverse, you may take this examination, which is competitive. Possession of the entrance requirement does not assure a place on the eligible list. All candidates who pass will be ranked according to their scores.

General Qualifications: Candidates must possess essential personal qualifications including integrity, initiative, dependability, good judgment, and ability to work cooperatively with others; and a state of health consistent with the ability to perform the assigned duties of the classification.

Examination Locations: When a written or performance test is part of the examination, it will be given in such places in California as the number of candidates and conditions warrant. Ordinarily, qualifications appraisal interviews are scheduled in Sacramento and Los Angeles. However, locations of interviews may be limited or extended as conditions warrant.

If a candidate's notice of oral interview fails to reach him/her prior to the day of the interview due to a verified postal error, he/she will be rescheduled upon written request.

Eligible Lists: Eligible lists established by competitive examination, regardless of date, must be used in the following order: 1) subdivisional promotional, 2) departmental promotional, 3) multidepartmental promotional, 4) servicewide promotional, 5) departmental open, 6) open eligible list. When there are two lists of the same kind, the older must be used first. Eligible lists will expire in one to four years unless otherwise stated on this bulletin. In the case of continuous testing examinations, names are merged into the appropriate



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lists in order of final test scores (except as modified by veterans preference credits) regardless of the date of the test, and the resulting eligible lists will be used only to fill vacancies in the area shown on the bulletin.
