Experience: Broad and extensive experience in actuarial work, at least five years of which shall have been in one or a combination of the following:

- 1. In a responsible governmental position involving the supervision and regulation of the actuarial practices of insurance companies; or
- 2. As an actuarial officer of a legal reserve life insurance company. (This experience must have been in a position equivalent to that of a senior actuarial officer who has responsibility for direction of an actuarial department and for formulation of actuarial policies and practices in a company with assets of approximately \$10,000,000.) or
- 3. As an actuary in general consulting practice, and Education: Either
- 1. Equivalent to graduation from college, preferably with specialization in mathematics. (Additional qualifying experience may be substituted for the required education on a year-for-year basis.) or
- 2. Possession of a fellowship in the Society of Actuaries.

Knowledge and Abilities:

Knowledge of: Insurance principles and actuarial science; legal principles as applied to insurance policy contracts; financial structure of various types of insurance companies; Department's Affirmative Action Program objectives; a manager's role in the Affirmative Action Program and the processes available to meet affirmative action objectives.

Ability to: Make complex and extensive actuarial and statistical computations; appraise accurately the financial structure of insurance companies from actuarial and statistical data presented; write clear and concise reports; analyze situations accurately and adopt an effective course of action; effectively contribute to the Department's affirmative action objectives.

Position Description

Under general direction of the Deputy Commissioner, Health Policy and Reform, the CEA is responsible for formulating health actuarial policy for the Branch. The CEA performs highly skilled actuarial analysis, and supervises the work of the health actuarial staff. The CEA provides health insurance policy input to the Commissioner and senior staff. The incumbent will formulate actuarial policy for the Department, perform highly skilled actuarial analysis, and supervise the work of the health actuarial staff, including new duties that may be required for CDI to implement the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA) and state health reform laws.

The position may be located in Sacramento, San Francisco, or Los Angeles.

STATEMENT OF QUALIFICATIONS (SOQ) - WEIGHTED 100 %

The desirable qualifications listed on this bulletin will be used to screen and evaluate the application, resume, and SOQ; therefore, it is critical that each applicant include specific information and examples on how his/her background, knowledge, abilities, and personal characteristics meet the minimum and desirable qualifications. The SOQ must include your total years of experience (and civil service classification, if applicable) performing each of the qualifications. The application, resume, and SOQ may be the only basis for the candidate's final score and rank on the eligible list.

All applicants must possess the knowledge and abilities, and any other requirements, described in this announcement.

This examination will consist of a SOQ evaluation. The SOQ is a narrative discussion of your education, training, experience, and skills to meet the minimum and desirable qualifications in qualifying for the position. The SOQ serves as documentation of each candidate's ability to present information clearly and concisely in writing and should be typed and no more than three pages in length.

A minimum rating of 70% must be attained to obtain list eligibility. **Résumés will not be accepted in place of the required SOQ. Candidates who do not submit a SOQ with their application will be eliminated from this examination.**

Desirable Qualifications:

In addition to evaluating each candidate's relative ability, as demonstrated by quality and breadth of experience, the following factors will provide the basis for competitively evaluating each candidate:

- 1. Broad and extensive experience in actuarial work in a responsible executive-level and/or managerial position involving the supervision and/or regulation of the actuarial practices of insurance companies and/or health plans.
- 2. Demonstrated extensive experience as an actuarial manager of a legal reserve health insurance company or health care service plan or state insurance regulator. Demonstrated experience in providing expert counsel and guidance to executive-level management.
- 3. Demonstrated experience in the application of insurance principles and actuarial science (e.g., product pricing, product development, and financial reporting for insurance companies).
- 4. Experience in the development and implementation of health-care related policy, particularly in connection with the Affordable Care Act.
- 5. Ability to maintain effective working relationships with the Insurance Commissioner, Executive staff, public officials nationwide, other government employees, industry executives (e.g., consultants, analysts, actuaries), international commissions, consumer groups and organizations.
- 6. Experience in working on committees and/or boards of actuarial or regulator organizations (e.g., National Association of Insurance Commissioners, American Academy of Actuaries, Society of Actuaries).

Eligible Lists: Eligible lists established by competitive examination, regardless of date, are used in the following order: 1) subdivisional promotional, 2) departmental promotional, 3) multi-departmental promotional, 4) servicewide promotional, 5) departmental open, and 6) open. When there are two lists of the same kind, the older must be used first. Eligible lists will expire in one to four years unless otherwise stated on this bulletin.

General Qualifications: Candidates must possess essential personal qualifications including integrity, initiative, dependability, good judgment, and ability to work cooperatively with others. Candidates must be in a state of health consistent with the ability to perform the assigned duties of the class. A medical examination may be required.
