POSITION DESCRIPTION AND LOCATION(S)

Under direction, plan, organize, supervise, and assist with the preparation, cooking, and serving of food to residents and employees; supervise the maintenance of culinary equipment, supplies, and work areas; instruct culinary workers; and do other related work.

Position exists at the Department of Rehabilitation's Orientation Center for the Blind in **Albany, CA.**

EXAMINATION PLAN/SCOPE

This examination will consist of a Qualifications Appraisal Interview weighted 100%. In order to obtain a position on the eligible list, a minimum rating of 70% must be attained in the interview. Candidates who do not appear for the interview will be disqualified.

Scope: In addition to evaluating each candidate's relative abilities as demonstrated by quality and breadth of experience, emphasis in the interview will be measuring competitively, relative to job demands, each candidate's:

A. Knowledge of:

- 1. Principles, procedures, and equipment used in the storage, care, preparation, cooking (including baking), dispensing, and serving food in large quantities
- 2. Kitchen sanitation and safety measures used in the operation, cleaning, and care of utensils, equipment and work areas
- 3. Food handling sanitation
- 4. Food values as well as nutritional and economical substitutions within food groups
- 5. Principles of effective supervision
- 6. Food accounting
- 7. Use of purchase orders for food and equipment
- 8. Training methods
- 9. Department's Affirmative Action Program objectives
- 10. A manager's role in the Affirmative Action Program and the processes available to meet affirmative action objectives

B. Skill in:

- 1. Judging food quality
- 2. Preparation and cooking of all food groups

C. Ability to:

- 1. Plan palatable and adequate menus
- 2. Organize, and direct the work of others
- 3. Keep records and prepare reports
- 4. Keep inventories and make requisitions
- 5. Use appropriate equipment
- 6. Determine food quantities necessary for groups of varying size
- 7. Direct the preparation of special diets
- 8. Plan food production to schedule
- 9. Plan and conduct in-service training programs
- 10. Analyze situations accurately and take effective action
- 11. Effectively contribute to the department's Affirmative Action objectives

If conditions warrant, this examination may utilize an evaluation of each candidate's education and experience compared to a standard developed from the class specification. For this reason, it is especially important that each candidate take special care in accurately and completely filling out the application. List all experience relevant to the Requirements for Admittance to the Examination, Position Description, and Scope shown on this announcement. Supplementary information will be useful to the staff doing the evaluation.

SPECIAL PERSONAL CHARACTERISTICS

CAREER CREDITS	Career credits will not be granted in this examination.

It is the **candidate's responsibility** to contact the Department of Rehabilitation's Selection Services Unit in Sacramento at (916) 558-5545 three weeks after the final filing date if he/she has not received a progress notice.

If a candidate's notice of oral interview or performance test fails to reach him/her prior to the day of the interview due to a verified postal error, he/she will be rescheduled upon written request.

If you meet the requirements, you may take this examination. Possession of the entrance requirement does not assure a place on the eligible list. All candidates who pass will be ranked according to their scores.

The Department of Rehabilitation reserves the right to revise the examination plan to better meet the needs of the service if the circumstances under which this examination was planned change. Such revisions will be in accordance with civil service law and rules and all candidates will be notified.

Examination Locations: When a written test is part of the examination, it will be given in such places in California as the number of candidates and conditions warrant. Ordinarily, oral interviews are scheduled in Sacramento, San Francisco, and Los Angeles. However, locations of interviews may be limited or extended as conditions warrant.

General Qualifications: Candidates must possess essential personal qualifications including integrity, initiative, dependability, good judgment, and ability to work cooperatively with others, and a state of health consistent with the ability to perform the assigned duties of the classification.

Veterans' Preference: Will be awarded in this examination, pursuant to Government Code Section 18973.1, effective January 1, 2014, as follows:

- 1. Any veteran, widow or widower of a veteran, or spouse of a 100 percent disabled veteran, who achieves a passing score in an entrance examination, shall be ranked in the top rank of the resulting eligibility list. Any veteran who has been dishonorably discharged or released is not eligible for Veterans' Preference.
- 2. An entrance examination is defined, under the law, as any open competitive examination.
- 3. Veterans' Preference is not granted once a person achieves permanent civil service status.
