Candidates may apply for the exam once within a 12-month period. The names of persons successful in this exam will be merged onto an eligible list in order of final score.</p>

REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMITTANCE TO THE EXAMINATION	All applicants must meet the education and/or experience requirements listed below under "MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS" for the classification by the final file date of the examination. It is your responsibility to make sure you meet the education and/or experience requirements stated on this announcement on the date you submit your application.
*MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS	Possession of a Field Representative, Branch 2, license (General Pest) issued by the Structural Pest Control Board of the California Department of Consumer Affairs. (Candidates who have applied for, and are in the process of securing a license will be admitted to the examination, but must possess the license before appointment.)

<p>POSITION DEFINITION:</p> <p>EXAMINATION SCOPE</p>	<p>Under general supervision, to perform duties related to the control of vertebrate and invertebrate pests; to train other personnel in preventive methods of pest control; and to do other related work.</p> <p><u>KNOWLEDGE OF:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Structural Pest Control Act and Structural Pest Control Board Regulations2. Laws and regulations governing use of pesticides3. Rodents; noxious pests, such as spiders, ants and cockroaches; pests attacking humans, such as bedbugs, fleas, lice, mites, ticks, flies and mosquitoes; fabric pests, such as silverfish, firebrats, carpet beetles and clothes moths; cereal and miscellaneous pests; and general pests. <p><u>ABILITY TO:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Prepare written reports and records2. Identify and take steps required to control vertebrate and Invertebrate pests3. Train other personnel in preventative pest control methods
<p>BACKGROUND INVESTIGATION</p>	<p>Competitors who are successful in this examination will be required to complete (prior to appointment) a background investigation document, which information regarding certain arrests (regardless of conviction) and felony convictions must be divulged. Information collected on this document is distinct from that required on the Standard Application for Examination, Form Std. 678, and the Criminal Record Supplemental Questionnaire (CRSQ) that is filled out prior to the examination. The hiring agency uses the information obtained on the background investigation document to conduct background investigations and/or to determine an individual's suitability for employment.</p>

GENERAL INFORMATION:	<p>It is the CANDIDATE'S RESPONSIBILITY to contact the Department of Developmental Services' Testing Office four weeks after the final filing date if he/she has not received a progress notice. Applications are available at the California Department of Human Resources website: www.calhr.ca.gov. If you meet the requirements stated on the reverse side, you may take this examination, which is competitive. Possession of the entrance requirement does not guarantee a place on the eligible list. All candidates who pass will be ranked according to the final score.</p> <p>THE STATE PERSONNEL BOARD reserves the right to revise the examination plan to better meet the needs of the service if the circumstances under which this examination was planned change. Such revision will be in accordance with civil service laws and rules and all competitors will be notified.</p> <p>ELIGIBLE LISTS: Eligible lists established by competitive examination, regardless of date, must be used in the following order: 1) sub-divisional promotional, 2) departmental promotional, 3) multi-departmental promotional, 4) service-wide promotional, 5) departmental open, 6) open. When there are two lists of the same kind, the older must be used first. Eligible lists will expire in from one to four years unless otherwise stated on this bulletin.</p> <p>GENERAL QUALIFICATIONS: Candidates must possess essential personal qualifications including integrity, initiative, dependability, good judgment, and ability to work cooperatively with others; and a state of health consistent with the ability to perform the assigned duties of the class. A medical examination may be required.</p> <p>In open examinations, investigation may be made of employment records and personal history and fingerprinting may be required.</p> <p>RESTRICTED TRANSFER OF LIST ELIGIBILITY Transfer of list eligibility is restricted. You should take this examination ONLY if you intend to work at SDC. Transfer of list eligibility will be permitted between spot lists provided the requesting eligible can show "proof of change in residence" after the final file date of this examination. "Proof of change in residence" shall be defined as providing a copy of utility bill (e.g. gas, electric, telephone) reflecting the requesting eligible name, new address and start date of new service</p> <p>HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCE: Equivalence to completion of the 12th grade may be demonstrated in any one of the following ways: 1) passing the General Educational Development (GED) Test. 2) Completion of 12 semester units of college level work. 3) Certification from the State Department of Education, a local school board, or high school authorities that the candidate is considered to have the education equivalent to graduation from high school.</p>
