CROSS FILING INFORMATION: If you meet the entrance requirements for this class and/or for Public Health Nutrition Consultant I and/or Public Health Nutrition Consultant III (Specialist) and/or Public Health Nutrition Consultant III (Supervisor), you may file for all examinations on a single application. Indicate the class title(s) for which you are applying in the appropriate section of the application

FINAL FILING DATE: There is no final filing date. Testing is considered continuous as dates can be set at any time. The testing office will accept applications continuously and will notify and test applicants as needs warrant.

TESTING PERIOD: A candidate may be tested only once during any testing period. The testing period for this classification is January 1 through December 31.

POSITION DESCRIPTION: A Public Health Nutrition Consultant II, under general supervision in an assigned geographic area or special subject matter area, independently provides complex nutrition and program consultation and technical assistance to public and private agencies on the delivery of nutrition-related services; plans, develops, organizes, monitors, and evaluates nutrition and food service programs and studies; develops, coordinates, and conducts training programs; may serve in a lead capacity to nutrition consultants and other health related multidisciplinary staff; develops and evaluates program standards, policies, and procedures of average difficulty; and researches and writes articles and reports for various audiences.

Positions exist with the Department of Public Health and the California Department of Aging.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMITTANCE TO THE EXAMINATION: It is your responsibility to make sure you meet the education and/or experience requirements stated on this announcement on the date you submit your application. Your signature on your application indicates that you have read, understood, and possess the basic qualifications required.

NOTE: Applications/resumes **must** include “to” and “from” dates (month/day/year), time base, civil service class title(s), and range (if applicable) for all work experience. College course information **must** include title, semester or quarter units, name of institution, completion dates, and degree (if applicable). **Applications/resumes received without this information will be rejected. Applicants must submit a copy of official transcripts along with the application when using education to meet the entrance requirements for this examination.**

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: Qualifying experience may be combined on a proportionate basis if the following requirements include more than one pattern and are distinguished as Either I, or II, or III, etc.

Possession of a valid certificate of registration with the Commission of Dietetic Registration of the American Dietetic Association. (Applicants who are eligible for registration will be admitted to the examination, but they must secure the required certificate before they will be considered for appointment.)

NOTE: Applications must show the date of the applicant’s notice of eligibility for registration from the Commission on Dietetic Registration, the registration number, title, and expiration date must be on their application. (Applicants who are eligible for registration will be admitted to the examination, but they must secure the required certificate before they will be considered for appointment.)

Either I

One year of experience performing the duties of a Public Health Nutrition Consultant I, Range B, in California state service.

Or II

Experience: Two years of professional experience in nutrition or dietetics gained after obtaining eligibility for registration with the Commission on Dietetic Registration of the American Dietetic Association in nutrition or dietetics, at least one year of which shall have been as nutrition consultant in a public health agency or as an institutional dietary consultant. (Experience gained in California state service applied toward this pattern must include one year performing duties comparable to the Public Health Nutrition Consultant I, Range B.)

AND

Education: Possession of a Master’s Degree in Nutrition, Dietetics, Institutional Management, Public Health Nutrition, or other nutrition field.

DESIRABLE CHARACTERISTICS: Willingness to travel in an assigned area or throughout the State, work irregular hours, and possession of a valid driver’s license.

GENERAL QUALIFICATIONS: Candidates must possess essential personal qualifications including integrity, initiative, dependability, good judgment, ability to work cooperatively with others, and a state of health consistent with the ability to perform the assigned duties of the class. A medical examination may be required.

EXAMINATION INFORMATION: The entire examination will consist entirely of training and experience evaluation weighted 100%. The Training & Evaluation Questionnaire (T&E) is designed to elicit a range of specific information about each candidate’s knowledge, abilities, and potential to perform the duties of a Public Health Nutrition Consultant II. The T&E questionnaire will be sent via email to the applicants.

The Department of Health Services and California Department of Aging reserve the right to revise the examination plan to better meet the needs of the service if the circumstances under which this examination was planned change. Such revision will be in accordance with civil service law and rules and all competitors will be notified.

SCOPE: In addition to evaluating the candidate’s relative abilities as demonstrated by quality and breadth of experience, emphasis will be placed on measuring, relative to job demands, each competitor’s:

Knowledge of:

1. Principles of normal and therapeutic nutrition.
2. Recommended food requirements based on body needs for different age and occupational groups.
3. Expectant mothers and lactating women, and others with special food requirements, such as the chronic and terminally ill.
4. Environmental, sociological, cultural, and biological factors which influence food practices.
5. Nutrition and its application in the dietary control of disease as applied in public health programs.
6. Methods and techniques used in nutrition investigations and dietary studies.
7. Principles of program planning.
8. Principles of food safety and sanitation.

9. Educational methods in training others in the principles of nutrition and their application to various phases of public health programs.
10. Community and public health nutrition programs.
11. Comparative costs of various foods in relation to their nutrition values.
12. Health organizations, resources, and current social/ economic problems pertaining to public health nutrition.
13. Principles of group feeding and institutional management.
14. Consultative techniques.
15. Principles, programs, and practices of public health administration at national, State, and community levels.
16. Principles and methodology of research and statistical analysis.
17. Administration and organization of health care delivery systems
18. Techniques of program planning, development, monitoring, and evaluation.
19. Federal, State, and local laws, regulations, rules, and policies.
20. Principles of public administration including organization, personnel, fiscal, and contract management.

Ability to:

1. Learn, interpret, and apply State and Federal rules, regulations, policies, and procedures.
2. Effectively provide consultation and technical assistance.
3. Establish and maintain the confidence of and productive working relationships with other health disciplines, agencies, organizations, and the public.
4. Communicate nutrition knowledge for application by other disciplines and the public.
5. Analyze menus and diets for nutritional adequacy.
6. Reason logically and creatively.
7. Analyze situations accurately and take effective action.
8. Develop and effectively utilize all available resources.
9. Be flexible in approach to the solution of problems.
10. Develop and evaluate alternatives.
11. Implement and evaluate less complex programs, studies, and projects.
12. Conduct assigned portions of conferences, workshops, and training programs.
13. Communicate effectively.
14. Prepare reports.
15. Apply to public health programs the principles, techniques, and practices of nutrition.
16. Apply the methods and techniques used in nutrition investigations and dietary studies.
17. Train others in the principles of nutrition and their application to various phases of public health programs.
18. Recommend action on a variety of nutrition programs, project activities, staffing, and budgetary processes.
19. Develop and analyze proposed legislation, regulations, and health program standards.
20. Develop, implement, coordinate and evaluate nutrition programs.

ELIGIBLE LIST INFORMATION: Possession of the entrance requirement does not assure a place on the eligible list. In order to obtain a position on the eligible list, a minimum rating of 70% must be attained. Names of successful competitors are merged into the open eligible list established for use by the Department of Health Services and California Department of Aging in order of final scores regardless of testing date. Eligibility expires **24** months after it is established unless the needs of the service and conditions of the list warrant a change in this period.

Eligible lists established by competitive examination, regardless of date, must be used in the following order: 1) sub-divisional promotional, 2) departmental promotional, 3) multi-departmental promotional, 4) service-wide promotional, 5) departmental open, and 6) open. When there are two lists of the same kind, the older must be used first.

VETERANS' PREFERENCE: Effective January 1, 2014, Veterans' preference will be awarded to qualifying veterans who are successful in the examination in the form of Rank placement rather than points. All individuals awarded veterans' preference will be certified in Rank 1 of the eligibility list, regardless of score. All open exams/eligible lists will award veterans' preference, regardless of the classification.

Veterans' preference will be awarded in this examination, pursuant to Government Code Section 18973.1, effective January 1, 2014, as follows:

1. Any veteran, widow or widower of a veteran, or spouse of a 100 percent disabled veteran, who achieves a passing score in an entrance examination, shall be ranked in the top rank of the resulting eligibility list. Any veteran who has been dishonorably discharged or released is not eligible for veterans' preference.
2. An entrance examination is defined, under the law, as any open competitive examination.
3. Veterans' preference is not granted once a person achieves permanent civil service status.
